

## **CURBAR,CALVER & FROGGATT JOINT BURIAL GROUND COMMITTEE**

### **RULES**

Curbar, Calver and Froggatt joint burial committee, being the Burial Authority, is responsible for the administration and maintenance of the Burial Ground. The Committee meets four times a year in March, June, September and December.

The following rules must be observed:-

1. Application for internment shall be made to the Clerk to the Joint Burial Ground Committee.
2. Grave spaces shall be allocated consecutively in numerical order according to the number on the plan.
3. Applications for the erection of headstones, inscriptions and additional inscriptions shall be made to the Clerk to the Joint Burial Ground Committee and designs submitted before the work is executed.
4. Headstones shall be of limestone, sandstone or gritstone, preferably, but not necessarily, of local origin. Excessively dark coloured stone and the use of granite or marble will not be allowed. In case of doubt, advice should be sought from the Committee before the stone is prepared. Headstones should not exceed 2 feet 6 inches (76cm) in height and width and 3 inches (7.5cm) in thickness.
5. No kerbs shall be permitted.
6. The Burial ground shall be maintained in a level condition without any permanent earthen mounds.
7. No planting on the grave plot shall be permitted.
8. Vases to contain floral displays shall not exceed 12 inches (30.5cm) in height. For any other form of container, the consent of the joint Burial ground Committee shall be obtained before use.
9. Cremated remains may be interred in an existing grave, or otherwise in a part of the graveyard specifically reserved for the purpose.

### **NOTES**

1. The Joint Burial Committee may take such action, including the removal and disposal of any object which is necessary for ensuring the observance of the above regulations.
2. The fees for internment and monuments and Grants of Rights of Burial are displayed in the Burial Ground and may be inspected on request to the Clerk by appointment only.
